
1. INFORMATION ABOUT THE EVENT

FRICHE LA BELLE DE MAI + TEH

Dates: 16 April – 19 April, 2026

Location: Marseille, France

Host: Friche la Belle de Mai



2. MEET THE HOST

Before La Friche became La Friche, it was one of France's largest tobacco and cirgars factories, the SEITA. It employed nearly 1,000 women and men until it shut down in 1990.



Starting in 1992, a cultural project began to develop in the newly emptied buildings, at the behest of the city of Marseille alongside elected official for culture Christian Poitevin (also known by his artist pseudonym, Julien Blaine), and the director of System Friche Theater, Philippe Foulquié. In the months that followed, a number of producers, cultural operators and artistic teams joined the Friche project.

In 1995, with architect Jean Nouvel as President of the association, La Friche launched a study that would establish the ambitions and founding principles of La Friche la Belle de Mai, forging a close connection between the urban and cultural dimensions of the project.

La Friche is both a workspace for 70 resident organisations (400 artists, producers, and employees work here every day), and a cross-disciplinary venue (each year, over 600 artistic events are made available to the public). Every year, 450,000 visitors come to this 45,000 square-meter public space housing five performance spaces, a community garden, a playground and athletic space, a restaurant, bookstore, daycare, some 2,400 square meters of exhibition space, an 8,000 square-meter rooftop, 3 theater venues, 2 concert venues, and a training center.

It's not a coincidence that La Friche adopted the name of La Belle de Mai, the larger neighborhood surrounding it. Neighborhood youth feel welcome in the spaces that are open seven days a week, and the youngest Belle de Mai residents even have a daycare. La Friche opened the cinema Le Gyptis in 2014, which has since become a pillar of the neighborhood, and people from Belle de Mai and beyond feel at home in its many open spaces.

2. MEET THE HOST

ACCESSIBILITY

Because of La Friche architecture - two ground floors, three levels, multiple staircases, and its overall size - understanding the layout can be challenging for new visitors.

The "Red Path", painted on the ground, is the main circulation route through La Friche. It connects nearly all of the open spaces.


There is an elevator that covers every floor of the Friche, so every room and venues are accessible.

Children: Kids are welcome but must remain under parental supervision at all times.

Please note that no childcare services are provided.

Baby changing table is available in one of restrooms. Every room and venues are accessible. There is an elevator that covers every floor of the Friche.

Toilets will be gender-neutral in the main venue of the meeting.

3. TRAVELING TO MARSEILLE

BY PLANE



Fly into Marseille Provence Airport, an important hub connected to Europe, situated in Martigues.

From there, you can take a shuttle bus that will bring you to the train station Marseille Saint-Charles, located near the city center and a 12 minutes walk from la Friche.

The bus leaves every 10 minutes. And the journey time is about 25mins.

First departure from saint-Charles train station 3.30am - Last departure from Marseille Airport 1:50am (1:40am from november to april).

Departure from Marseille Gare St Charles at 3.30am, 3.45am, 4am, then every 20 minutes until 7.00am.

Every 10 minutes from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm, then every 20 minutes until 1.00 p.m. Last departure at 01.15 am (only from may to october)

Departure from the Airport at 4:05 am, 4:25 am, 4:40 am then every 20 minutes until 7:00 am

Every 10 minutes from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Every 20 minutes then until 1:40 am. Last departure at 1:50 am (only from may to october)

If you do not see a flight from your departure city, you can either check Nice's airport, then take a shuttle to Nice's train station and take a train to Marseille or a Flixbus to Marseille's train station.

Or you can check flights to Paris' airports Orly or Roissy Charles de Gaulle. There are many trains connecting those airports to Marseille's train station.

3. TRAVELING TO MARSEILLE

BY TRAIN



If you plan to come by train, Marseille is really well connected. The main train station is Gare Marseille Saint-Charles, located really close to the Friche la Belle de Mai.

3. TRAVELING TO MARSEILLE



BY CAR

Parking in Marseille: It is famously known in Marseille to not leave your care parked in some areas, because there are many break-ins, especially in the Belle de Mai district.

There is a paying parking in the Friche la Belle de Mai, you can access it by the entrace located at the 12, rue François Simon. The first 1h30 is free, then it's 1,20€/hour. If you need to leave your car parked for multiple days, contact us to find a solution, before April 6th.

The maximum height is 2,10m.

To car share from a close-by city (or from Italy) you can check: https://www.blablacar.fr/ Usually people posts their journeys a couple days before the departure.

4. GETTING AROUND MARSEILLE

PUBLIC TRANSPORT FIRST



Contrary to what you would expect, the public transports are not very developped in Marseille.

There are only 2 metro lines and 3 tram lines, that cover almost the same areas. The rest is covered by buses.

Trams and metros run from 5:30am to around midnight.

Buses run from 5:30am to around 9pm depending on the lines, then nightbuses cover the service from 9pm to 1am. Here is the website of the public transport company RTM: https://www.rtm.fr/en

Use <u>Google Maps</u>, the <u>RTM app</u> or <u>Citymapper</u> to check the itineraries and timetables. Bear in mind that buses are almost never on time!

Where to get tickets: in the buses, and at almost every tram and metro stations. Contactless payment terminals are also available in all the public transports.

Useful information:

To get in the bus, make a sign at the bus stop when it arrives to signify to the driver that you need to get in.

To get out of the bus, don't forget to press the button to tell the driver that you need the doors open at the next stop.

4. GETTING AROUND MARSEILLE

ACCESSIBILITY



Majority of the city is not very accessible, the cars often park on the sidewalk, and the sidewalk are also in very bad shape.

All metro stations have escalators, and some also feature an elevator (Saint Charles, Rond-Point du Prado and Vieux-Port for example. To check if they are functionning, check out this page: https://www.rtm.fr/escalators-et-ascenseurs

The trams are all wheelchair accessible.

For buses, only some stops are wheelchair accessible, you can check on the app here: https://www.rtm.fr/actualites/lapplication-mobile-rtm

5. GETTING TO LA FRICHE



La Friche is open every day of the year from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM, but the events and activites vary throughout the day, and throughout the year.

ADDRESS & ACCESS

2 possible entrances:

- JOBIN (main entrance pedestrians only): 41, Jobin street · 13003 Marseille
- SIMON (parking): 12, François Simon street · 13003 Marseille

The meeting's headquarter will be in the venue called the **Cartonnerie**, located on the 2^{nd} floor of the building, near the restaurant's terrace. If you get lost, you can ask for indications at the welcome dest at the entrance JOBIN, otherwise, follow the red line on the floor and the blue and yellow signs.

TRANSPORTS

Bike

5. GETTING TO LA FRICHE

To get back to the town centre (leaving from Canebière Bourse every hour from 8.15 pm only wards. Last bus leaves at 0:45)

Metro

Lines M1 & M2 to Gare Saint-Charles (train station) or M1 to Cinq Avenues-Longchamp/ then a 15 minutes walk.

Tram

Line T2 to Longchamp (runs until midnight), then a 10 minutes walk.

Walk

From Marseille Saint-Charles / 12 minutes walk.

Get out of the station through the bus station and follow the Honnorat street, that transforms into the Guibal street. It's a straight road that gets you to the entrance at 41 Jobin street.

Car

There is a parking in the Friche la Belle de Mai, the entrance is located at the 12, François Simon street.

The first 1h30 is free, then it's 1,20€/hour. If you need to leave your car parked for multiple days, contact us to find a solution, before April 6th.


The maximum height is 2,10m.

8. COMMUNITY HOSTING IN LA FRICHE



We have a couple rooms available in the Villa 2013, a house located in la Friche, for people who struggle with the prices of the accommodation in Marseille. It is usually the place where we welcome artists on short residencies or during festivals that take place in our venues.

It's a small house with 9 individual rooms (single or double beds available), divided in two floors with a shared bathroom and a shared toilet on each floor. Common areas are the kitchen located on the basement floor and a living room on the ground floor.

Bear in mind this place is quite old, very basic and is more similar to a hostel than a B&B/hotel/rental.

BEACHES, HIKES, SIGHTSEEING

The closest beach from the city center is the Catalans beach.

If you have one day or a half-day ahead of you, here are 3 adventure ideas:

- Go to the Frioul Islands
- Hike in the Calanques National Park and visit one of the 3 most accessible and beautiful calanques: Sugiton,
 Morgiou or Sormiou
- Take a trip to the Blue Coast and visit the cute village of Niolon

11. PRACTICAL INFORMATIONS



Official language: French is the official language. Brace yourselves, English is not widely understood outside touristy areas and hotels.

Some useful words:

11. PRACTICAL INFORMATIONS



Currency: Euro

Paying: Most shops, cafés and restaurants accept cards. Carry a small amount of cash for markets and small shops.

Weather: Mid-April in Marseille, the weather is usually around 10 to 20°C, don't forget to bring sunglasses as the weather is usually very sunny and a swimsuit to have a taste of the Mediterranean sea.

Refill your bottle: Tap water is safe to drink, helping us all cut plastic waste.

Sort waste: Separate bins for paper-plastic-metal, glass and general waste are common city-wide.

Good shoes: Bring confortable walking shoes, Marseille is a city where we walk a lot to get around.

12. HEALTH, SAFETY & EMERGENCIES



Emergency numbers:

Call 17 if you require the police.

Call 15 for emergency medical assistance or 18 if there is a fire.

You do not need to use the dialling code to ring the emergency services.

You can also call 112, the pan-European emergency number (police, fire, or ambulance, one number for everything).

Pharmacies: There are a lot of pharmacies around la Friche, the closest are

Health cover: EU/EEA visitors - bring your **EHIC** for medically necessary care. For other - we recommend carrying travel insurance.

Everyday safety: Marseille is generally safe but be careful with your belongings when walking around in the city centre or sitting at terraces. Generally don't leave your valuables unattended in public spaces.

On site: If you feel unwell or need help, please contact the event team and we'll support you right away.
